USAGE & PURPOSE

ASK YOURSELF: "What am I going to use my pontoon for—fishing, leisure, or recreation?"

Do you want to chat, chill, cast, or cruise? While some pontoons accommodate all activities easily, other models are specialized for specific uses.

FISHING

If you're passionate about fishing, seek features like cushioned swivel seats, rod holders, tackle storage, aerated livewells, a rigging/bait station, a fish finder, and a trolling motor.

RECREATION

If you anticipate lots of water sports, look for a powerful engine, towing capability, equipment storage, and textured flooring.

LEISURE

If relaxed cruises and socializing are more your speed, consider features like a sun deck, bimini or sunshade, sound system, ample seating, and add-ons like tables and interior lights.







SIZE & CAPACITY

ASK YOURSELF: "How many people will I typically bring on the boat, and what are my vehicle's towing capabilities?"

Little crew? A small pontoon will do. Lots of friends? Bigger is better! Where larger pontoon boats provide more storage and room for friends, smaller pontoon boats are typically easier to maneuver, dock, trailer, and store. Consider both when choosing your size.

SMALL PONTOON BOATS

16'–20' | 6–8 passengers

MID-SIZED PONTOON BOATS

20'–25' | 8–12 passengers

LARGE PONTOON BOATS

25'–30' | 12–16+ passengers







ENGINE & STRUCTURE

Now that you know what you want to do and who you'll be bringing along for the fun, make sure your boat and engine are up to the task.

HORSEPOWER MATTERS Consider the amount of power you'll need to support your favorite activities.

Low Range (9.9–50 HP) – Economical engines ideal for casual cruising and light activities

Mid Range (50–115 HP) – A good balance of power for cruising, water sports, and occasional towing

High Range (115–250+ HP) – Impressive power for high-speed cruising, heavy towing, or water sports

GIVE 'EM HULL Standard pontoons are equipped with two tubes, but some models have (or offer) a third. Both builds have their benefits.

Two Tubes

More affordable to buy and maintain

Three Tubes

- Smoother, more stable ride
- Higher weight and horsepower capacity
- Better for water sports







FEATURES & AMENITIES

ASK YOURSELF: "What will enhance the ways I want to spend time on the water?"

The key word here is *enhance*. By now, you know what activities you'll be most focused on and what is required to make those things possible. Now that you know the features you need, focus on the options you want.

SEATING CONFIGURATION

Look for seating arrangements that suit your preferences for space and movement. Many pontoon boat models offer several layout options such as walk-through, L-shaped, or 4-position fishing. Some models also have options for dual helms and conversion lounges.

STORAGE

No matter how you use your pontoon boat, you're going to want maximum storage. When considering the right model, ensure there's sufficient storage space for gear, coolers, and personal items.

ADDITIONAL FEATURES

Amenities like helpful swim ladders, shade-providing bimini tops, party-enhancing sound systems, essential charging ports, and convenient built-in coolers can make a real difference in your time on the water.







BUDGET

ASK YOURSELF: "What amount am I comfortable spending up front and on an ongoing basis?"

It would be awesome if everyone could pick their perfect pontoon based solely on the considerations we've listed above, but let's be real—our choice ultimately boils down to the price point and what we're comfortable spending.

INITIAL COSTS

Compare prices to find a pontoon that fits your budget and ticks all your boxes. The cost can really vary based on size, brand, features, and whether it's new or used. If you're planning to transport the boat, don't forget to factor in the cost of a trailer.

ONGOING COSTS

Factor in costs for things like insurance, maintenance, storage, and fuel. It's always worth your time to research and compare options and providers to get the most from your money.
